Setting

• Jesus begins to speak in parables for the first time. Prior to speaking in parables, He spoke plainly, using clear explanations and examples.

• After healing a demon-possessed blind and mute man (Matthew 12; Mark 3), Jesus is accused by the leaders of the law that His powers come from the devil.



Parables

- Parables are stories that reveal kingdom truths.
- Jesus' goal through parables was to help those who were committed to know and understand the kingdom and what it is like

Matthew 13:10-13 (NIV)

- ¹⁰ The disciples came to him and asked, "Why do you speak to the people in parables?"
- ¹¹ He replied, "Because the knowledge of the secrets of the kingdom of heaven has been given to you, but not to them.
- ¹² Whoever has will be given more, and they will have an abundance. Whoever does not have, even what they have will be taken from them.
- ¹³ This is why I speak to them in parables:



Mysteries of the Kingdom

- Mystery is a Greek word mustérion.
- It is not something unknowable. Rather, it is what can only be known through revelation, i.e. because God reveals it.
- Therefore, it is not necessarily something that is difficult to understand.
- Is information that is hidden from people that are not initiated into a group where that knowledge is made known to people who belong to that group.

Luke 8:13 (TPT)

• 13 The seed falling on the gravel represents those who <u>initially respond to the</u> word with joy, but soon afterward, when a **season** of <u>harassment of the</u> enemy and <u>difficulty</u> come to them, <u>they whither and fall away</u>, for they have no root in the truth and their faith is temporary.

Luke 8:14 (TPT)

• 14 The seed that falls into the weeds represents the hearts of those who hear the word of God but their growth is quickly choked off by their own anxious cares, the riches of this world, and the fleeting pleasures of this life. This is why they never become mature and fruitful.

Luke 8:15 (TPT)

• 15 The seed that fell into good, fertile soil represents those <u>lovers of truth</u> who hear it deep within their hearts. They respond by clinging to the word, <u>keeping it dear</u> as they endure all things in faith. This is the seed that will one day bear much fruit in their lives."
