Working Definition for Divine Alignment

Positioning oneself so that one is in tune (harmony, agreement) with God's perfect will for their life.



(1) Obedience is proof of Divine Alignment



Luke 2:48-51 (NIV)

- 48 When his parents saw him, they were astonished. His mother said to him, "Son, why have you treated us like this? Your father and I have been anxiously searching for you."
- 49 "Why were you searching for me?" he asked. "Didn't you know I had to be in my Father's house?"
- ⁵⁰ But they did not understand what he was saying to them.
- ⁵¹ Then **he went down to Nazareth with them and was obedient** to them. But his mother treasured all these things in her heart.



Philippians 2:5-8 (NIV)

- ⁵ In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus:
- ⁶ Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage;
- ⁷ rather, he made himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness.

(3) Making Disciples is proof of Divine Alignment



Matthew 4:8-22 (NKJV) - Four Fishermen Called as Disciples

- 18 And Jesus, walking by the Sea of Galilee, saw two brothers, Simon called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea; for they were fishermen.
- 19 Then He said to them, "Follow Me, and I will make you fishers of men."
- ²⁰ They immediately left *their* nets and followed Him.
- ²¹ Going on from there, He saw two other brothers, <u>James</u> the son of Zebedee, and <u>John</u> his brother, in the boat with Zebedee their father, mending their nets. <u>He called them</u>,
- ²² and immediately they left the boat and their father and followed Him.



Luke 6:12-16 (NKJV) - The Twelve Apostles

- ¹² Now it came to pass in those days that He went out to the mountain to pray and continued all night in prayer to God.
- ¹³ And when it was day, He called **His disciples to** *Himself*; and from them He chose twelve whom He also named apostles:
- 14 Simon, whom He also named Peter, and Andrew his brother; James and John; Philip and Bartholomew;
- ¹⁵ Matthew and Thomas; James the *son* of Alphaeus, and Simon called the Zealot;
- ¹⁶ Judas *the son* of James, and Judas Iscariot who also became a traitor.



Matthew 28:16-20 (NIV) - The Great Commission

- ¹⁶ Then the eleven <u>disciples</u> went to Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had told them to go.
- 17 When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted.
- ¹⁸ Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me.
- 19 Therefore go, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit,
- ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."



(4) Consistent implementation of spiritual disciplines is proof of Divine Alignment



Luke 5:16 (NIV)

¹⁶ But Jesus **often** withdrew to lonely places and **prayed.**

Example 2

Luke 18:1 (NIV)

¹Then Jesus told his disciples a parable to show them that they should always pray and not give up.

1 Peter 4:7 (NLT)

⁷The end of the world is coming soon. Therefore, **be earnest and disciplined** in your prayers.



(5) Suffering in the kingdom is proof of Divine Alignment

1 Peter 3:18 (NLT)

¹⁸ Christ suffered for our sins once for all time. He never sinned, but he died for sinners to bring you safely home to God. He suffered physical death, but he was raised to life in the Spirit



Suffering for being a Christian - 1 Peter 4:12-16,19 (NLT)

12 Dear friends, <u>don't be surprised</u> at the fiery trials you are going through, as if something strange were happening to you.

13 Instead, be very glad–for these trials make you <u>partners with Christ in his suffering</u>, so that you will have the wonderful joy of seeing his glory when it is revealed to all the world.

14 If you are <u>insulted</u> because you bear the name of Christ, you will be blessed, for the glorious Spirit of God rests upon you.



¹⁵ If you <u>suffer</u>, however, it must not be for murder, stealing, making trouble, or prying into other people's affairs.

¹⁶ But it is no shame <u>to suffer for being a Christian</u>. Praise God for the privilege of being called by his name!

19 So if you are suffering in a manner that pleases God, keep on doing what is right, and trust your lives to the God who created you, for he will never fail you.

¹⁰ My goal is to know Him and the power of His resurrection and the fellowship of His sufferings, being conformed to His death,



Conclusion

 Purpose in your heart to divinely align yourself just as Jesus Christ divinely aligned Himself.



One purpose of the cross is divine alignment.

A divine exchange took place on the cross.

- He took from us what we ought <u>not to bear</u> in exchange for all that <u>we must endure</u> to live as victorious kingdom citizens.



 To divinely align will mean that we ought to willingly accept certain experiences and lifestyles. For example,

- Obedience
- Humility
- Discipleship Making
- Spiritual Disciplines
- The fellowship of His sufferings.
- **Persecutions**



1 Peter 2:21-25 (NLT)

- ²¹ For God called you to do good, <u>even if it means suffering, just as Christ suffered for you</u>. He is your example, and you must follow in his steps.
- ²² He never sinned, nor ever deceived anyone.
- ²³ He did not retaliate when he was insulted, nor threaten revenge when he suffered. He left his case in the hands of God who always judges fairly.

He personally carried our sins in his body on the cross so that we can be dead to sin and live for what is right. By his wounds you are healed.

To once you were like sheep who wandered away. But now you have turned to your Shepherd, the Guardian of your souls.
